RE: Kindergarten to Grade 12 Mask Mandate

(Excerpt from letter sent to families this afternoon)

Earlier today, Provincial Health Officer Dr. Bonnie Henry and Education Minister Jennifer Whiteside announced a Kindergarten to Grade 12 mask mandate for all schools in B.C.

Beginning Monday, October 4, all students in Nanaimo Ladysmith Public Schools will be required to wear non-medical face masks while indoors, including at their desks and on school buses. This measure builds on the existing guidelines that currently apply to all students in Grades 4 to 12. Masks will be available for students that may not have their own.
